

City of Strathmoor Manor: December 2, 2025 Commission Meeting

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Strathmoor Manor City Commission for December 2, 2025, was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Brian Cobb.

Present at the meeting were Mayor Brian Cobb, Commissioners Nick Clifton, Dean Brooks, Casey Perez, William Mathews, Chief Lamey, City Counsel John Harrison and Clerk Pam Cook. A quorum was present allowing the conduct of business.

Minutes:

We will review the August 2025 minutes in January's meeting.

October 2025 minutes were approved.

Police Business:

Chief Mike presented the October and November 2025 police report.

Resident Concerns:

A resident raised a concern of a Ford Explorer parked on Emerson rarely moved; the matter will be referred to Chief Mike for follow-up.

General City:

Mr. Harrison has not yet acted on the bonding process for the Treasurer. The council discussed bonding Mr. Clifton for \$100,000 to remain consistent with Mayor Cobb. It was clarified that the City Clerk does not need to be bonded.

Mr. Perez shared a target date of the day after Thunder over Louisville for the annual city gathering. Ideas include music, a possible food truck, and face painting. The council will discuss the event in greater detail in January.

City Business/Legal:

Mr. Harrison has not received any additional information regarding the vacant lot appraisals. However, the Commissioners have observed the appraiser in the neighborhood visiting the properties, indicating that the review is underway.

Mr. Harrison provided an update on the ordinance regarding the Maintenance Department and the council's decision to split duties. No changes are required; instead, the department will have two co-directors, each responsible for managing a designated area.

Financial Business:

Commissioner Clifton emailed the October 2025 financial report.

Property taxes are almost all in.

Mayor Cobb will email the Jeffersontown League of Cities regarding dues.

Maintenance:

The previously communicated tree work has started. Commissioner Matthews brought up an additional tree on Strathmoor, a maple, that may need to be reviewed for possible removal.

Commissioner Perez presented a bid from Minuteman Press for road signs and will contact additional companies for comparison. The council also discussed adding the “City of Strathmoor Manor” name to the signs, along with the potential for neighborhood markings that include the city name.

The council reviewed Nalley’s Lawn Service and Landscaping’s proposed snow removal agreement. Commissioner Brooks made a motion to approve the three-year contract at \$6,000 per year, and Commissioner Matthews seconded. All members voted in favor, and the motion carried.
